These aspirations lay the foundation for a prosperous, united, and influential Africa. Thus, this conference serves as a crucial platform for such enlightenment, but it is only the beginning. We must commit to being the narrators of our own stories and the architects of Africa's future.

To achieve this, we must invest in robust education, placing science and innovation at the forefront. A healthy populace is vital, as is the transformation of economies and job opportunities. institutions like LSI and ADCCCI and the cultivation of transformational leadership at all levels that we will realize this aspiration.

A peaceful and secure Africa is the goal of the fourth aspiration. Conflict prevention mechanisms must be operational at all levels, paving the way for dialogue-driven resolutions. Peace education must be a cornerstone, nurturing a culture of tolerance and understanding. Women are key to these conversations and should take a major stand to be included in these types of strategies as the AFCFTA protocol on Women and Youth and the AU Decade of Women's Economic and Financial Inclusion (2020-2023) that the African Diaspora Collective has decided to take up this initiative as a key factor in our progress moving forward for my Women and Girls focus area through my office starting with the Inaugural 2023 African Women's Empowerment Summit starting 30 October to 5 November here in Accra.

The fifth aspiration strives for an Africa with a robust cultural identity and shared values. We must reinvigorate the spirit of Pan-Africanism and that of our traditional rulers, drawing strength from our common heritage and respecting our diverse religious landscape is where we need to focus. The traditional rulers of Africa have the responsibility to engage with the youth and the next generation so we work together as the African Diaspora especially are coming back to Africa and want to understand the culture but also have you understand that a sub culture was created and evolved over the 400 years since we were taken so it will take a while for us to come to a happy medium where tradition and current systems through technology can thrive together.

Aspiration six underscores that Africa's development hinges on its people, especially its women and youth, with a commitment to caring for our children. Gender equality and the empowerment of youth are paramount. Only by ensuring every individual, regardless of gender or age, has the opportunity to flourish, can we create a truly inclusive Africa.

The seventh and final aspiration envisions Africa as a global force, a united and influential player in world affairs that can only be successful by fully utilizing the ENTIRE Diaspora but especially those that are descendants of the Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade. We must actively engage in global governance systems and take responsibility for our own development through advocacy training for the youth, for Africans by Africans. This entails strategic partnerships that align with our growth priorities and are determined to move towards self-financing.

So, how do we accomplish all of these aspirations in the net 40 years, by 2063? Basically, if I had another 40 years to plan...here is what I would do and what we are thus committing to as the African Diaspora Collective and the African Diaspora Collective Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

These aspirations are not mere words on paper; they are the guiding principles that shape our collective mission at the African Diaspora Collective. Today, we affirm our commitment to this mission, to realize an Africa that is not only united within itself but one that includes her Diaspora and plays a pivotal role on the global stage.
